



# Tennessee Traditional Flies

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## Prince Czech Nymph

April - September

Hook: KONA BJH #12-#16

Bead: Gold slotted bead to match hook size

Lead Free Wire: To match hook, 8 -15 wraps

Thread: UTC 70 Olive

Tail: Whiting 5 to 6 Tiling Fibers Light Pardo

Ribbing: Ultra Wire SM Gold


Body: Peacock Herl

Legs: Hen Hackle Dark Brown


Wing: Turkey Biots White

Collar: Gray squirrel dubbing

Step 1: Attach bead to the hook. Small hole first.



Step 2: Mount the hook in your vice.



Step 3: Add eight to fifteen wraps of lead free wire.



Step 4: Slide the wraps up inside the bead and trim the tag end.



Step 5: Start the thread behind the lead-free wire.



Step 6: Cover the lead-free wire with thread and wrap thread back to just before the bend of the hook and remove tag end of the thread.



Step 7: Attach hook shank tail to the hook shank at the end of the thread.



Step 8: Wrap the thread up to the lead-free wire.



Step 9: Take a single piece to Peacock Herl and break off the brittle end and attach just behind the lead-free wire.



Step 10: Wrap thread and secure with thread back to just before the bend of the hook.



Step 11: Attach Ultra Wire to the hook shank at the end of the thread wraps.



Step: 12 Wrap the fly with thread back and forth over the abdomen and lead-free wire several times building a profile.

End with your thread just behind the bead.





Step 13: Carefully wrap the pPeacock Herl with touching wraps.

Wrap up to just behind the bead and tie it off and trim the tag.



Step 14: Counter wrap the wire up to just behind the bead.



Step 15: Tie off the wire and helicopter the wire to break it off close.



Step 16: Prep hen feather

1. Remove a hen feather from cape
2. Remove fuzz fiber from feather
3. Hold the feather by the tip and pull back the fibers so the stand straight off the quill
4. Trim fibers so that you have about an 1/8" fibers remaining
5. Preen the tip to expose the very tip of the feather and trim.

Step 17: Attach hen feather just behind the bead.



Step 18: Pull back the feather fibers and wrap the feather around the shank one and a half turns.

Bind the stem of the feather and trim the tag.



Step 19: Pull the hackle fibers rearward and add thread just behind the bead to create a landing pad for the next material.





Step: 20 Separate two White Turkey quills.



Step: 21 Lay the Turkey biots on top with the tips expending back to the end of the abdomen and tie them in both at the same time. You want the biots to splay out and up slightly.



Step 22: Wrap the thread tight up to behind the bead then pull back the tags and add a couple wraps in front of the biots then behind.



Step: 23 Trim the butts of the biots.



Step: 24 Add a couple wraps of thread to secure the biots.



Step: 25 Dub gray squirrel around the collar.



Step: 26 Pull back the collar and whip finish thread behind the bead.



Step: 27 Preen out the collar dubbing with your Velcro brush. Cement collar.
